Cedars-Sinai Medical Center

THE \$350 million Advanced Health Sciences Pavilion at Cedars-Sinai Medical Center when completed in summer 2013 will be the latest outpatient tower at the West Los Angeles hospital, already one of the largest medical complexes west of the Mississippi. The 440,000-square-foot building at Gracie Allen Drive and San Vicente Blvd. will house the medical center's heart institute and the neurosciences departments, as well as outpatient clinics and surgery suites. Architect HOK began work in Oct. 2009, with general construction contractor Hathaway Dinwiddle Construction Co. starting a few months later. As of last month, most of the building's glass façade was completed. In March, work is set to begin on the second of two pedestrian bridges linking the tower to the existing medical center.
